

Single-Member Districts

The root of most electoral evils

MPs can only represent the voters who actually voted for them.

In Single-Member Districts, only half of voters, on average, voted for their MP.

The 50% of voters, who didn't vote for their MP, have ZERO representation.

In order to represent multiple points of view, there need to be multiple MPs in each district.

Un-Equal Legislative Power of Voters - 2015

This chart shows that Canadians who voted federally in 2015 will have vastly different amounts of influence over the laws & policies which affect them between 2015 and 2019.
